integrity. We all need more similar activities taking place in Europe", said Gianluca Rocco, Chief of IOM Mission in Greece.


40 minors from IOM shelters along with other young athletes of the academy competed for the championship reflecting solidarity and social fellowship, unlocking their potential to become better athletes.

# IOM Supported More than 2,500 Unaccompanied Children Hosted in Emergency Shelters

The project is currently supported by the Swiss contribution to reducing economic and social disparities in the EU and the Ministry of Migration & Asylum. The IOM emergency accommodation facilities are coordinated by the Special Secretary for the protection of UMC.







IOM Mission in Greece joined forces with the Social Development bank in Europe (CEB) in 2015. Throughout the years to follow, a strong partnership was developed as a response to migration challenges raised in Greece. With the goal of creating a protective environment for unaccompanied children, IOM and CEB worked together on the Greek islands

of Chios and Lesvos. Thanks to CEB's interventions children arriving alone in Greece, were supported with dignified shelter and received individualized assistance, through protection services and daily 24-hour staff presence. As a result of the comprehensive intervention more than 2,000 unaccompanied children got support.


# Voluntary Returns in a Glance

During the reporting period May / June 2023 - 380 migrants were assisted to return to their home countries. Meanwhile, the total number since the beginning of the project in September 2019, accounts to 10.375 voluntary returns. Amongst them, 37 % were from Georgia, following 23% from Pakistan, 13% from Iraq, 4% from Bangladesh and 23% from various other countries.

The project is co-funded by European Funds (Asylum, Migration and Integration Fund) and 25% by National Funds.

"As soon as I met HELIOS staff, I wanted to know everything about the Greek market, the gaps, and the needs. After the meetings we had and the research I did, I realized that there is a great interest for real estate in Greece, and under their guidance, I established my own company."
