April 2020 – April 2021: One year of EU Relocation - 3,654 people have been relocated from Greece to 13 European countries.



During April the project <u>Voluntary relocation scheme from Greece to other European Countries</u> completed one year of implementation. During this period 3,654 people were relocated from Greece to 13 European countries, carrying hopes & dreams of a better future.



People with special talents and thirst for knowledge, children with dreams for a better future, men and women who seek to be active in their everyday life and develop their skills, take the floor and share their experiences.






HELIOS project

IOM launched the collective photo exhibition "Exploring our cities", with works of 38 amateur photographers, both local Greeks and refugees who found a new home in Greece.



MERIMNA project




IOM celebrated the day of Happiness organizing painting activities for the children residing on the Safe Areas of Lesvos, Chios, Kos, Samos!

In total 1,513 unaccompanied children received support in all 5 Safe Areas, since the beginning of the project. More specifically, in Lesvos: 533, Chios: 449, Kos: 189, Leros: 105 and Samos: 237, where 4 teams are operating on all islands (Lesvos, Chios, Kos and Samos). Among them, 1,214 are male and 299 are female.

The Safe Area teams operate under IOM's project <u>MERIMNA</u> with the support of European Commission – DG HOME.
