116 refugees travelled for the first time directly from Lesvos island, Greece to Germany under EU Relocation



During February through the <u>Voluntary relocation scheme from Greece to other European Countries</u> project, 116 refugees travelled from Lesvos island directly to Germany. This was the first direct relocation flight from a Greek island to another European country under the project. Up to date, 426 recognized refugees have been relocated from Lesvos – Greece to Germany.

The action is implemented by IOM with the funding of the European Commission & the support of the Greek Government, the Ministry of Migration and Asylum, the Special Secretary for the protection of UMC and the General Secretary of Migration Policy. In partnership with European Asylum Support Office - EASO, UNHCR and UNICEF.

Amid 2020 Pandemic IOM Supported Over 2,500 migrants with Voluntary Return from Greece



IOM supported the voluntary return of some 2,565 people from Greece to their home countries in 2020, in coordination with the Greek authorities and respective countries' diplomatic representatives. Amid hardships and challenges induced by COVID-19 in the past year—including mobility restrictions and closed borders—many migrants living in Greece expressed interest in returning voluntarily to their home countries.





Since the beginning of the project and up to the 19th of February 2021, 11,576 beneficiaries have received rental subsidies, upon finding independent housing.



MERIMNA project



IOM organized painting activities for the children residing on the Safe Areas of Lesvos, Chios, Kos, Samos, range from the simplest painting with a brush or hands to more elaborate spin art.

In total 1,446 unaccompanied children are accommodated and receiving support in all 5 Safe Areas. More specifically, in Lesvos: 500, Chios: 443, Kos: 183, Leros: 105 and Samos: 215, where 4 IOM teams are operating on all islands (Lesvos, Chios, Kos and Samos). Among them, 1,157 are male and 289 are female.

The Safe Area teams operate under IOM's project <u>MERIMNA</u> with the support of European Commission – DG HOME.
