The International Organization for Migration (IOM) is committed to the principle that humane and orderly migration benefits migrants and society. As the leading international organization for migration, IOM acts with its partners in the international community to: assist in meeting the growing operational challenges of migration management; advance understanding of migration issues; encourage social and economic development through migration, and; uphold the human dignity and well-being of migrants.

In Greece, IOM is focusing on responding to the Mediterranean migrant's crisis, in support of the Greek Government and in cooperation with all other agencies involved. IOM currently implements interventions within the areas of emergency, preparedness and response, disaster risk reduction, livelihoods, healthcare and psychosocial assistance, assisted voluntary return of migrants, migration and development, resettlement and repatriation, family reunification, counter human trafficking, assistance to vulnerable migrants.

Internal and external candidates are eligible to apply to this vacancy. For the purpose of the vacancy, internal candidates are considered as first-tier candidates.

Context:

In close collaboration with national authorities and experienced Partners, through the HELIOS project IOM aims at promoting the integration of beneficiaries of international protection and temporary protection into the Greek society through the provision of integration courses, the support for independent living, including rental subsidies, activities for employability support, activities for the sensitization of the host community and integration monitoring.

Under the overall supervision of the Project Coordinator (Integration) and the direct supervision of the Project Assistant (Integration), the successful candidate will provide support in implementing project activities of the Integration component of the project.

Core Functions / Responsibilities:

- 1. Monitor the integration progress of beneficiaries through one-on-one sessions.
- 2. Perform the enrollment of beneficiaries in the project.
- 3. Ensure the adherence to the Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs) and project regulations, as developed in the framework of the Project.

- 4. Assess potential protective and risk factors of individuals and families facing difficulties (personal resilience, shared belief systems, social support networks, etc.).
- 5. Provide information to beneficiaries on welfare rights, housing, access to health care services and education, etc.
- 6. Develop rapid needs assessment of the psychosocial needs of children, youth and their families.
- 7. Prepare case reports and statistics to be submitted on regular basis alongside monthly reports.
- 8. Conduct referrals to other actors for cases in need of specialized further treatment.
- 9. Coordinate with other actors and relevant authorities to ensure that needs of beneficiaries are met.
- 10. Ensure accurate data entry and quality physical archiving of Means of Verification.
- 11. Collaborate with other project units for the most efficient implementation of activities.
- 12. Perform any other duties as may be assigned.

Required Qualifications and Experience

Education

- University degree in Social Work, Psychology or a related field from an accredited academic institution with minimum two years of relevant professional experience.
- Master's degree in above fields an advantage.

Experience and Skills

- Previous work experience in a similar role;
- Excellent communication and negotiation skills, personal commitment, efficiency and flexibility;
- Ability to work with minimal supervision;
- Good level of computer literacy;
- Demonstrated ability to work well under pressure and keep deadlines;
- Strong work ethics and commitment to humanitarian principles;
- Ability to work under difficult conditions.
